

National Update: New CEO; Urgent ERA action

This summer, **Celina Stewart** was named as the new CEO of the LWV. A legal expert, voting rights champion, and lifelong democracy defender, Celina first joined LWVUS in 2018 as the director of advocacy and litigation. She later stepped into the role as the organization's chief counsel, spearheading voting rights, redistricting, and equal rights cases to great success. As Celina recently said, "We are living in a truly unprecedented and historic time. Every day, there's a new attack, and women are being called to save our country. And that call is urgent. We don't have time for fear or hesitation. ... So, all I need to know now is: who is with me?" We are Celina; we are!

League of Women Voters Issues Nation-Wide Call for Urgent Action for Equality

Leading up to Women's Equality Day (August 26-30), the League of Women Voters of the United States and League chapters from all 50 states and the District of Columbia sent a letter to the White House and members of Congress urging action for the immediate publication of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) in the US Constitution. December 2024 marks 101 years since the ERA was first introduced in Congress. "We must address the root cause of inequality by amending our Constitution, and it needs to happen now," said Celina Stewart, CEO of the League of Women Voters of the US. "It is shameful that over 100 years after some American women gained the right to vote, women continue to battle systematic discrimination..."


Here are some of the things we've been up to in the last few months:



- **L** Haverstraw Head Start Summer Picnic. Members of our team participated in the event, providing information about the League and more importantly, helping eligible parents and friends register to vote.
- 2. Spring Valley High School. League members met with dozens of students to get them registered and preregistered to vote. As part of their curriculum, students learn about the importance of voting and were eager to get involved.
- **3.** County Naturalization Ceremonies. Emotions always run high as several of our members helped welcome and celebrate our county's newest U.S. citizens. The event, held several times a year at the Rockland County Fire Training Center in Pomona, is the perfect opportunity for us to provide information on voter registration and to acclaim the citizen privilege of voting!
- **4**. Students in Albany. As reported in the last issue of the newsletter, RCLWV sponsored two local high school students to participate in the annual Students in Albany (SIA) program. Ashley Ely (North Rockland High School) and Abigail Koshy (Clarkstown High School North) attended the multi-day program where they had a front row seat to how New York State Government works. They shadowed their representatives, spent time in the state chamber, participated in discussions on current topics and events, and met and networked with peers from high schools across the state. They represented themselves and the RCLWV outstandingly, as evidenced by the fact that they both received internships this summer with their representatives.
